THE HENNENBERG CACHETS
Stamps Carry a Message:
Cachets tell the rest of the story

Under then President of the Society of Israel Philatelists (S.I.P.) Cleveland Chapter the first label was designed by Jacob Hennenberg, followed by many more Cachets.

- Slide 1:** First design of the label. It portrays the connection between U.S.A. and Israel through Holy Land philately. It created furor in the Arab newspapers because at that time the Tower of David (depicted in the label) was in Jordanian occupied Jerusalem. Maybe Mr. Hennenberg's depiction was a prediction of what would become Israeli territory after the 1967 War to the present.
- Slide 2:** S.I.P. Great Lakes Regional Seminar in 1966.
- Slide 3:** Washington, D.C. S.I.P. Exhibition 1966.
- Slide 4:** First day issue with Cleveland Chapter Cachet honoring Eleanor Roosevelt – cancelled in Israel and the U.S. with the same date.
- Slide 5:** Cachet in honor of the Americans landing on the moon.
- Slide 6:** Honoring Columbus, Ohio S.I.P. Chapter November 20, 1969 led by then President Howard Chapman.
- Slide 7:** Same design as previous slide cancelled Tel Aviv – Yafo November 20, 1969.
- Slide 8:** Postcard in honor of the 22nd anniversary of the State of Israel cancelled June 13, 1970 at the S.I.P. Convention Station, Willoughby, Ohio. Held in conjunction with the Israel Numismatic Society.
- Slide 9:** Postcard cancelled June 13, 1970 at the S.I.P. Convention Station, Willoughby, Ohio.
- Slide 10:** Design in honor of "the flying carpet" bringing the Jews out of Yemen. Mr. Hennenberg modified the wings of the plane with wings of a bird. The Jews of Yemen were supposed to come to a gathering point traveling through the desert. Israel supplied the trucks to bring them to the assembly point. They refused to enter the trucks; they preferred walking through the desert. When the Jewish Yemenites arrived at the airport they did not hesitate to go into the plane. Their explanation was with the prophecy of our teachings declaring "On

the wings of the eagles I will bring you home.” (Psalm). Cancelled June 13, 1970, S.I.P. Convention Station, Willoughby, Ohio.
